Understanding each option will help you identify what works best for your child:

- Daycare Centres: Provide care and basic educational activities in a structured setting.
- Preschools: Focus on preparing children for primary schooling with a blend of play-based and academic learning.
- Montessori Schools: Emphasise self-directed learning and handson activities in a prepared environment.
- Reggio Emilia Approach:

 Encourages exploration and project-based learning in a collaborative setting.
- Home-Based Care: Provides small group care in a caregiver's home, offering a family-like environment.

Educational Inspirations

- Dr. Emmi Pikler: Focuses on respectful caregiving, autonomy, and the significance of building strong relationships between caregivers and children.
- The Virtues Project: Centres on character development and social emotional learning, promoting virtues like respect, responsibility, empathy, and perseverance.
- Te Whāriki: Is a holistic curriculum framework that supports children's learning and development, emphasising empowerment, holistic development, family and community relationships.

By incorporating these principles, we aim to create a nurturing environment that supports each child's unique journey and development in a homelike learning environment.

Checklist: What to Consider

- Philosophy: Does the programme's teaching philosophy align with your parenting style and values?
- Curriculum: Is the curriculum playbased, academic, or a blend of hoth?
- Teacher Qualifications: Are the educators certified and experienced in early childhood education?
- Class Size & Ratios: Are the class sizes and teacher-child ratios appropriate for your child's age?
- Safety & Cleanliness: Is the environment safe, clean, and wellmaintained?

Step 2: Visit and Observe

Once you've shortlisted a few places you would like to view, it's time to visit and observe them in action.

Here's how you can make the most of your visit:



- Schedule a Tour: Call ahead and schedule a tour during regular hours to see the programme in action.
- 2. Observe Interactions: Watch how teachers interact with the children. Are they engaged, nurturing, caring and supportive?
- 3. Check the Environment: Look for a stimulating, well-organised, and safe environment. Are there diverse and age-appropriate materials available?

Evaluating Early Education Programmes

Step 2: Visit and Observe

- 4. **Ask Questions:** Prepare a list of questions to ask during your visit. For example:
- What does the daily programme offer?
- How many settling visits would you like my child to do?
- Will my child have a primary caregiver/key teacher to build trust and develop a sense of security?
- How do you communicate with parents about their child's progress and developmental achievements?

Checklist: Questions to Ask

- How does your programme support social and emotional development?
- What is your approach to encouraging language and literacy skills?
- How do you incorporate outdoor play and physical activities?
- How are children's individual needs and learning styles accommodated?





CHAPTER 3

Making the Final Decision

Step 3: Reflect and Decide

After your visits, take some time to reflect on your experiences.

Consider the following points:

- Your Child's Needs: Which environment did you and your child respond to best? How did you feel when there?
- Your Instincts: Trust your instincts as a parent. Which programme felt like the right fit for you and your family?
- Programme Reputation: What do other parents say about the programme and what it offers families? Do they have a good reputation in the community?





Action Plan: Making the Choice

- Compare Your Options: Use the checklist to compare your top choices based on the factors that matter most to you.
- Speak with Other Parents: Reach out to other parents who have experience with the programmes you're considering.
- Make a Trial Run: If possible, try a few trial days or sessions to see how your child adjusts to the new environment.
- Make the Decision: Choose the programme that best meets your child's needs and your family's values.
